

#### **WHO WE ARE**



- Rae Alexander (Executive Director): A career educator, Rae is the head cross country coach at Olmsted Falls High School. Rae has coached cross country and track for over 40 years, guiding 100+ high school runners to All-Ohio honors. Rae has extensive experience as a youth camp and race director. Rae founded GOH Run in 2018, and her vision made the Guardian Mile a reality. She serves as the Guardian Mile race director, and also the directs our year-round youth programming.
- GOH Run Board: The GOH Run board is made up of life-long runners with diverse professional experience. #### **MISSION**



- The CDC recommends <u>60 minutes or more</u> of moderate-to-vigorous daily physical activity for kids ages 6-17. Only 24% currently meet this recommendation. Physical inactivity increases the risk of obesity, cardiovascular disease, Type 2 diabetes, osteoporosis, and certain types of cancer.
- GOH Run is a nonprofit (501(c)(3)) founded in 2018 to promote health and fitness in our community through the sport of running. One of our primary goals is expanding access to quality youth running programming in the area to teach healthy lifestyles through, camps, training groups, races, and other engaging activities.
- We aim to provide unique experiences and mentorship. The Guardian Mile provides the entire Northeast Ohio community and especially our youngest runners with the opportunity to race a challenging and iconic course while interacting with and learning from the best runners in the world.

#### 2022 YEAR IN REVIEW



- Guardian Mile IV on Saturday, July 23<sup>rd</sup> 2022.
- A record 566 runners crossed the Hope Memorial Bridge, up 23% from 2021. The race has now averaged 27% annual participant growth for Guardian Miles I-IV, despite a <u>challenging environment for road races nationwide</u>.
- GOH Run youth programming (day camps, fun runs, and fall training programs) again saw record numbers. Our programs in Olmsted Falls, Strongsville, Sandusky, and Cleveland (in partnership with <u>Boys and Girls</u> <u>Club of Northeast Ohio's Broadway location</u>) all increased in participation.



## Mission Goal: Expanding Youth Access

- We again offered free registration to the Guardian Mile to runners and teams from the Cleveland Public Schools in 2022. We also continued outreach to private / charter schools that cater to families of limited economic means.
- We are thrilled with our ongoing partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Northeast Ohio! Our July 2022 day camp at their Broadway location was again free for club members. We love working with the Boys & Girls Club and continue to discuss expanding this partnership in the future.
- It is our goal that no runner or team with interest in the Guardian Mile or GOH Run programming should be unable to participate due to financial need. We were awarded a USATF Foundation grant for 2021-22 that helped us expand access. We hope to further integrate Guardian Mile sponsors with our year-round youth programming to achieve this goal.

#### 2022: What Was New!



- We welcomed two new Hometown Hero sponsors, Fleet Fleet Cleveland and ASICS.
   Both made a significant impact on our race weekend experience. Cleveland Water joined our Finish Line Festival with hydration and giveaways.
- Inspired by the excitement of team scoring in our HS / Youth Heat, we debuted the Fleet Feet Cleveland Team Challenge for area run clubs and groups in our Community Heat.
- We partnered with our friends at <u>Mudroom Backpacks</u> to add to our unique awards collection, offering custom Guardian Mile Mudroom packs for select division winners!

# A Commitment to Fast and Fun



- In addition to our goal of building one of the largest and most enjoyable community road races in Ohio, we have strived since our inception to bring world class runners to the streets of Cleveland. Since 2018, our elite heats have produced 30 sub-4 minute miles on the men's side, while 30 women have broken 4:40.
- Eight former Olympians (5 men, 3 women) have competed in the Guardian Mile. In 2021 and 2022, <u>our elite heats</u> produced the fastest and deepest road miles in the world outside of <u>The Fifth Avenue Mile</u> in New York City.
- In 2021, we became the only U.S. road mile outside of The Fifth Avenue Mile to use fully automatic timing (FAT) for our elite heats qualifying and record purposes. In 2022 we increased our total prize purse to over \$23,000 across elite and community heats, an internationally competitive purse for a road mile.

## **Year IV Highlights**



- 664 total registrations (up 32% from 2021) for the GOH Run High School / Youth, Fleet Feet Community, Nordonia Dental Stroller, Tom C. Loepp Masters, and Monticello Associates Elite Heats / Divisions. Runners of all ages and backgrounds competed for bragging rights, fun, and over \$23,000 in total prize money.
- Thrilling elite races featuring winners (Josette Norris and 2021 Champion Johnny Gregorek) again breaking the race and all-time Ohio soil records (4:19 and 3:46), with raucous crowd support.
- A truly unique experience for all on the legendary Hope Memorial Bridge. Runners conquered the hill. Spectators enjoyed the races and breathtaking views.

## Year IV Highlights



- National anthem performed by Cleveland sports personality Gabriella Kreuz, DJ / announcements at start / finish, <u>Instagram live stream</u> of all races.
- The Finish Line Festival again provided free Mitchell's Homemade Ice Cream and Georgio's Pizza for runners. Cleveland Water provided hydration and giveaways, and StretchLab and Ohio Sports Chiropractic & Rehab were available for post-race treatment.
- Commentary, interviews, awards, gear sale, and the Ohio Legends post-race photo provided a great atmosphere during, between, and after races!
- Post-Race Party (21+) at Market Garden Brewery, located near the starting line, with food trucks, music, and a limited release of Guardian American Lager on tap.
